As of May 12, 2021 - Internet Benefits will be available for qualifying households.

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is an [FCC program](#) designed to help households struggling to pay for internet service during the pandemic. This new benefit will connect eligible households to jobs, critical healthcare services, and virtual classrooms. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.

Eligible households will be able to enroll in the **Emergency Broadband Benefit Program**, which will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband (internet) service. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

- Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh offers Chromebook bundles for checkout.
 - The bundle includes a Chromebook, Wi-Fi hotspot, external mouse, and power cables for both devices. You can request a bundle by placing a hold in the [Library Catalog](#).
 - The checkout period on all of these devices is 21 days. Renewals are not available, due to the high demand for the devices.

2. **Internet Essentials** through Xfinity. Please click on the following link to learn about low cost or [free internet access](#) **through the Affordable Connectivity Program**. Signing up is easy.

4. **Lifeline**: If you or someone in your household participate in a federal assistance program, you may qualify for [Lifeline](#). Lifeline provides a discount of \$9.25 per month for either your phone or internet bill (but not both) and is limited to one discount per household.
5. **Computer Reach** refurbishes computers and makes technology available to people at a fraction of the cost. They also offer computer literacy, training, and support.
6. **PC on a Stick**: Turn Your Smart-TV into A Computer A stick PC or PC on a stick, is a single-board computer in a small elongated casing resembling a stick, that can usually be plugged directly into an HDMI video port on a TV or Monitor. **Note: Please ensure that the PC Stick will meet your academic needs before you purchase.**
